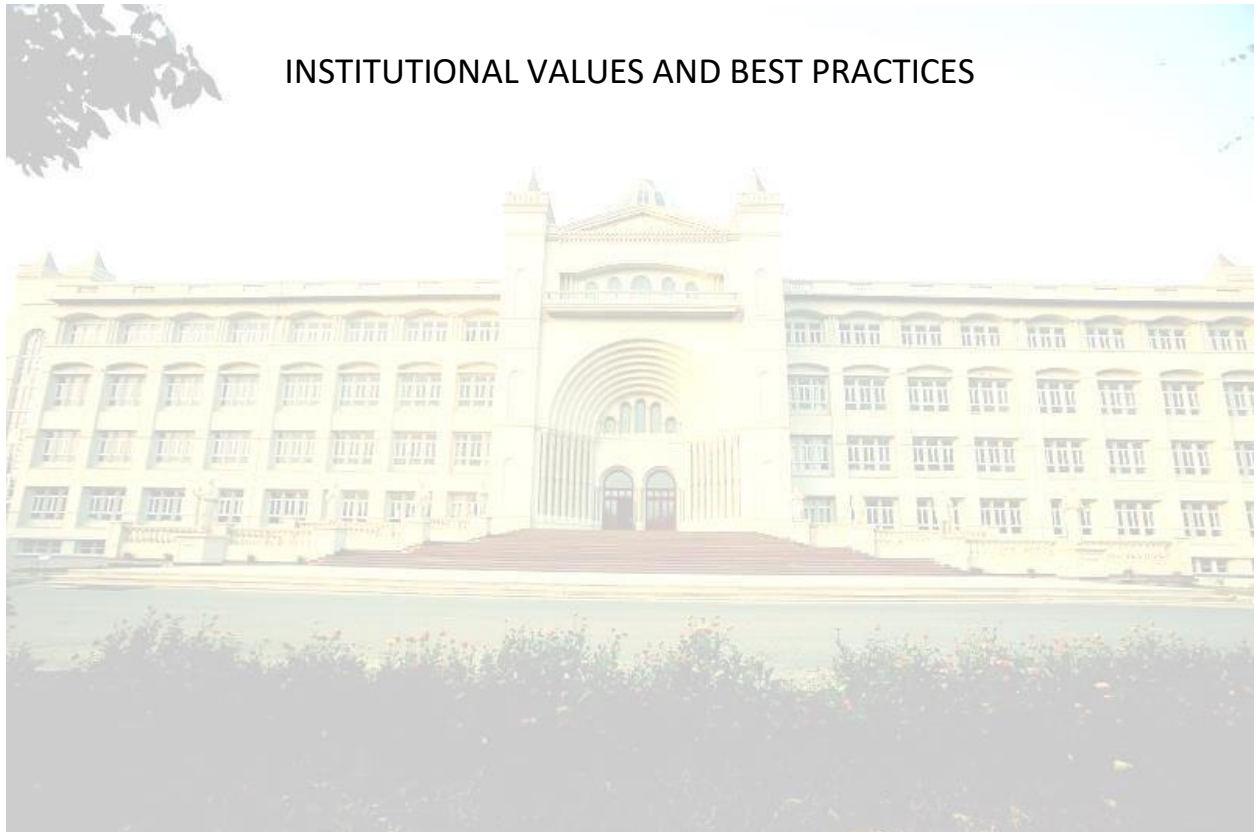

Brief Profile of Safety and Security Officers:

GM H&S : General Manager(Horticulture & Services):

Mr. Ashok Ranwa (Retired Commandant from Border Security Force) is presently looking after the duties of General Manager (Horticulture & Services). Earlier he was associated with the Ministry of Home Affairs as Deputy Secretary (Air) having 28 years of commendable experience in Security Management, Administration, Intelligence, and Bomb Disposal in IAF/BSF/MHA. The Security expert having extensive experience in detection and investigation of several sensational and complicated cases, which won honours. Skilled at supervising security operations and internal investigations relating to security issues, security intelligence and surveillance systems.

He had conceptualised and implemented security procedures and systems across the designated area of operations to ensure a secure & safe work environment. Possess vast experience with the highest echelons of Government of managing successfully difficult and nebulous situations, hard policing, and security situations of all types.

He is overall in charge of Safety & Security at Mody University.

ASO (Assistant Security Officer):

Presently, Captain Dayaram Tanwar is looking after the duties of security in charge. He had rendered 30 years of service in Indian Army. After having retired in Oct 2018, he had joined campus as Assistant Security Officer. He had undergone various training and courses related to security in Indian Army and had various appointments in different ranks & capacities. Under GM. H&S, he looks after the safety & security, control room and transportation of Mody University including Gate Management.

Safety and Security

1. We aim to provide the best possible security to your child. Security options like CCTV cameras, Fire alarms and extinguishers, help us in this endeavor. Ex-military security personnel provide round the clock security. We also liaise with emergency services to provide aid if and when required. Fire and earthquake drills are a regular feature. Counselling sessions with staff, students and parents are undertaken to apprise them of the security measures in place.
2. All women/Girl students are accommodated in campus thus providing a safe and secure environment for them. We have 12 hostels for school girls and 10 hostels for UG/PG courses girl students. Our Campus is of 265 Acres & same is totally fenced / walled from all around except two gates for entry/ exists. In all we have about 800 school students in the hostel and 1400 UG/PG student in the hostels.
3. We have a total of 16 guards during day to monitor in/out entry of persons and deployed along the fence/wall each at a visual distance from each other. During night 16 guards are deployed along the fence with torches.
4. Visitors are permitted with in laid down timing as per manual of rules procedures (MORP). The male members including parents are not permitted to enter into the hostel and a female visiting the hostel into the hostel is given a limited time to visit to protect & privacy of other hostellers.
5. Proper identity cards are issued to the students for entry/exit after due approval has been taken from parents/warden/dean/principal. During local outing/outing to Jaipur strict timing are adhered to. They are accompanied to Jaipur by our institute conductor in the bus.
6. We have two lady residential doctors with five lady GNM and three maid servants also the dental checks is carried out once a week by the lady dentist who comes to clinic on weekly basis from Sikar.

7. All students staying inside a hostel, the instruction of the lady wardens who lives in the adjust room made for the warden.
8. We provide most secured campus for the women/girl university. There is a zero tolerance for sexual harassment.
9. We follow Anti-Ragging rules and guidelines of Supreme Court. Strict monitoring on guidelines by the University authority or if any students found violating the guidelines would be punished and penalized as per the norms.

ADDITIONAL POINTS:

(i) Process of Students Outing (Jaipur and Local) under safety and security:

Upon receipt of the parent's consent through mail/writing the concern department hostel warden allows the student for outing to Jaipur or Local. The interested students are issued out passes. Based on the out pass every student is allotted a ticket and a dedicated seat in the bus.

Students board the bus under strict supervision and guidance of warden/security staff. The university driver and conductor/security staff accompanies the students to the destination and back. The bus halts at designated stops only. On arrival of the students after outing, all students are counted and board in the bus. All students carry their university I Cards. The parents are informed of the safe arrival of students in campus.

(ii) Process of Students Entry and Exit at time of admission or afterward:

The students and parents desirous of seeking admission to university are first received at Security Parlour. All Covid appropriate behavior procedures are followed at the security parlour (Reception). After verification and filling up of relevant credentials in the register, the visitors are issued with visitor passes. The parents/students are given university vehicle/escort vehicle, which takes them to Admission department.

The parents/students are made to visit the campus under guidance. Upon exit , the parents/students deposit back the visitor pass at the security parlour. Thereafter they are made to exit out of the gate.

The students coming alone after leave/vacation are received at main gate and after showing their I Card, they are requested to endorse their arrival details. It is ensured that the student follows all the relevant Covid protocols laid down by Govt and university time to time.

The students are given dedicated vehicle to drop them to the concerned hostel. For the movement of the student inside the campus, there is regular campus shuttle ply during the day time.

(iii) Security measures in form of guidelines, rules which apply to students as safety and security concerns

The university follows very strict rules and regulations as far as the entry and exit procedure from the two gates. Gate No.1 is used for entry and exit of students and employees and Gate No. 2 is used for dedicatedly for goods and commercial vehicles. There is a guideline in form of MORP the said purpose (MORP Entry Exit Procedure Attached).

(iv) Additional technologies used for safety and security like cam, drone, etc.

The whole security parlour area (Reception Area) is under CCTV surveillance 24x7. All the activities of entry/exit and movement in and around reception are recorded with a backup. All students and employees of the university wear and show their I Card on entry and exit from the gates. There is a biometric machine installed at the Reception for entry exit record of the employees and the student's entry is made manually in the register.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION IS THE

The University shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed herein under:

- The Anti Ragging Committee of the University shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the act of ragging established.
- The Anti Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the act established by the Anti Ragging Report, resort to those found guilty, use or resort to the following punishments, namely:
 - Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
 - Withholding scholarship, fellowship and other benefits
 - Withholding results
 - Excluding from appearing in any exam, examination or other evaluation process
 - Excluding from representing the institution in any regional, national or international event, tournament, sports meet etc.
 - Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
 - Expulsion from the University for period ranging from one to four semesters
 - Expulsion from the institution and permanent disbarment from admission in any other institution for a specified period. Provided that where the person committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to punitive punishment.

ACTIVITIES AMOUNTING TO RAGGING AND SCOPE OF ANTI RAGGING MEASURES

According to UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Education Institutions, 2009, the committee has been constituted to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the menace of ragging in the University including:

- any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

PROSECUTION

Students found guilty of ragging shall be liable to be prosecuted in accordance with the provisions of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 and the Indian Education Act, 1947.

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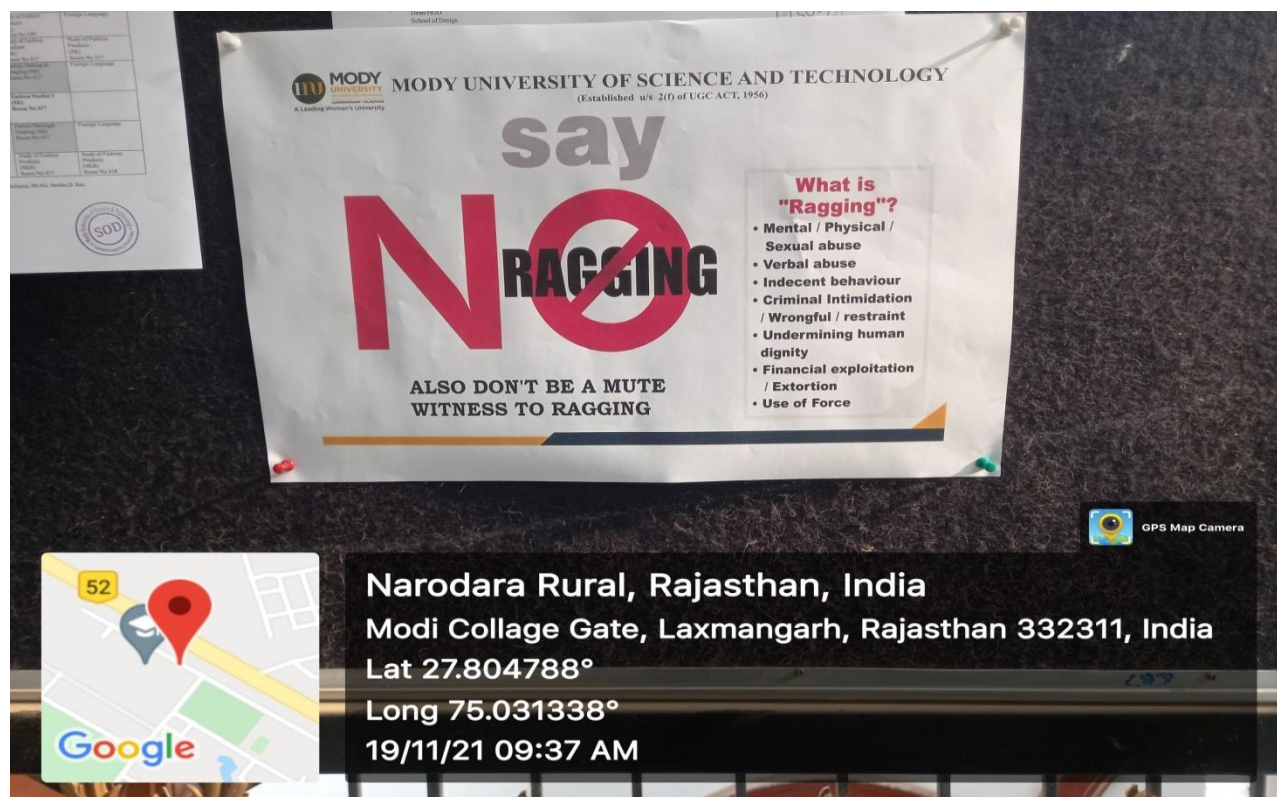
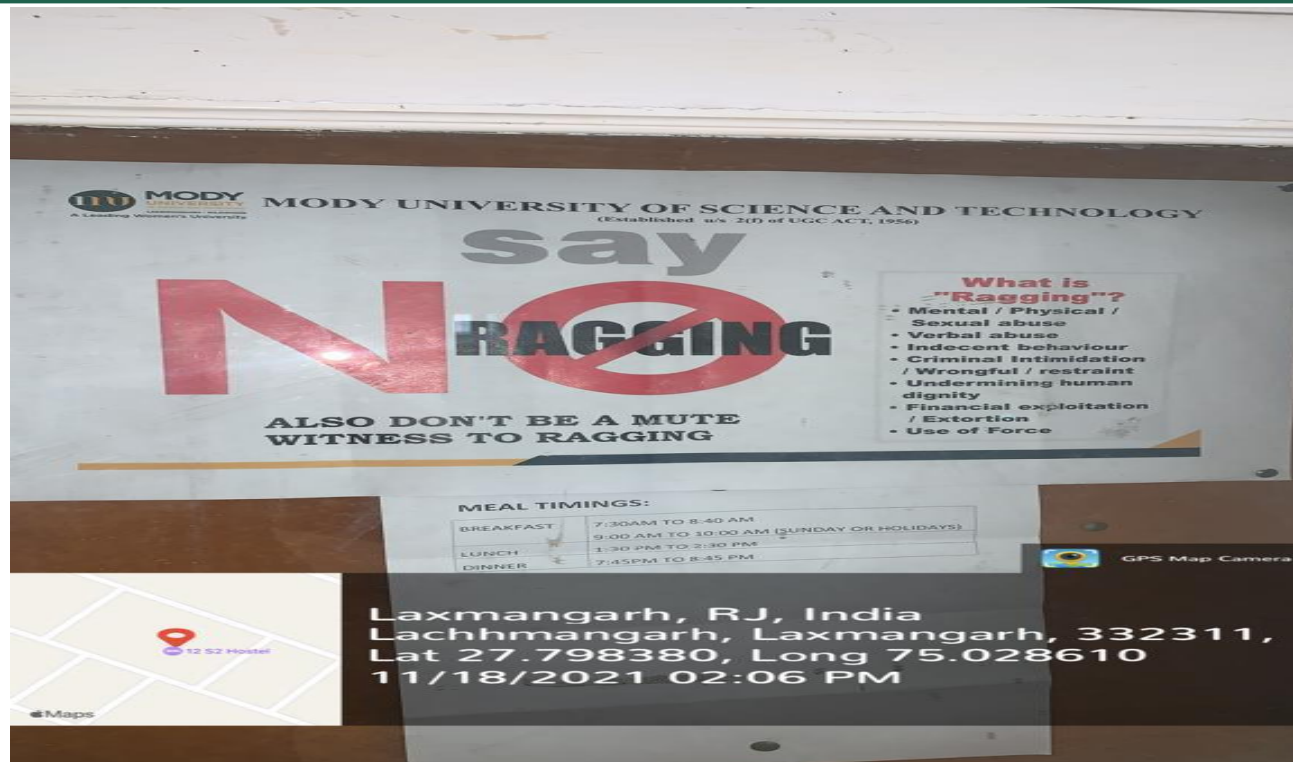

- any conduct by any student or students or teacher by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, teasing or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- outraging in words or in disguised activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to cause fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- asking any student to do any act which such student will not do in ordinary course of study and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or humiliation or embarrassment or so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students;
- any act of financial extortion or financial expenditure burdened upon a fresher or any other student by students;
- any act of physical abuse including all variants of it, sexual abuse, harassment, sexual stripping, sexual abuse and sexual acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- any act or abuse by spoken words, gestures, post, public facility which would also include displaying obscene pictures, obscene or obscene text from activity or passively participating in the abuse (here in fresher or any other student);
- any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sinister pleasure or deriving off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION IN CASE OF RAGGING

The University shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed herein under.

a) The Anti Ragging Committee of the University shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established.

b) The Anti Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the act established by the Anti Ragging Committee, suspend, or remove from duty, one or more of the following punishments, namely:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges;
- Withholding/ withdrawing scholarships/ fellowship and other benefits;
- Debaring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process;
- Withholding results;
- Debaring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, sports festival, etc.
- Suspension/ debarment from the hostel;
- Cancellation of admission;
- Debarment from the University for period ranging from one to four semesters;
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarment from admission to any other institution for a specified period. Provided that, where the present committee is aggrieved the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

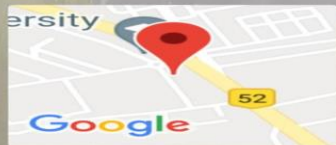

REPORT

Counseling for Students

The Mody University of Science and Technology of Science and Technology emphasizes on help and counseling for students and counselors are made available as a service in all campuses.

At the time of admission, for students including girl students, general counseling is provided to highlight the importance of the academic courses, also provide a guideline to the initiation of a courses, and counseling for general behavioral and psychological problems. Reorientation programmes are arranged for freshers to make the subject easy. Mentors are allotted for each 10 students for student welfare and to guide them properly. A student's counseling committee for every 20-25 students one faculty counselor is appointed who help the students in academics, co- curricular and extracurricular activities.

The Counseling Cell works on the objectives:

1. To crystallize the problems of the students (academic and non-academic) and reaching an optimal solution.
2. To help the student to make her decisions, to work out a plan for solving her difficulties and to take action on the plan developed.
3. To help the student know herself, better her interests, abilities, attitudes, opportunities and resources.
4. Identification of students who needs services from the committee by self-reports by students.
5. Counseling sessions are provided for students, on a periodic basis.
6. Regular class committee meetings with teachers and students are conducted. If a student is irregular, the root cause of the problem is deciphered.

7. Female students are free to discuss any of their personal issues with the counsellor and Women Grievance Cell functioning in the school.

Psychology faculties has been appointed as counsellors to counsel students in dealing with personal issues, mental stress, depression, general disinterestedness in studies, ward-parent and student-faculty relationships, failing in examinations, losses etc. The counsellor in charge of a particular batch of students will be maintaining a file, which may contain the detailed activities and reports of counselling sessions which will be kept confidential. Professional counseling is also done by psychologists, and if needed, psychiatrists for mental stress, depression, anxiety etc. and various invited talks are done to improve the mental and spiritual well-being of students and staff.

The Women grievances cell which looks after the issues pertaining to women. Women Grievances cell can deal the cases (if any) very confidently with its team of functional head of the cell and senior women faculty members. The cell also conducts different activities to encourage women to fight against any kind of injustice resulting from gender bias. The school organizes various workshops and seminars on stress and time management, by eminent resource persons. Also, different activity clubs are in campus, like personality development, literature and poetry, film society, SAMAJ, etc. so students can improve their skills, hobbies etc.

To enhance the spiritual life, self-awareness, maintain good mental health of students, to unlock the potential of student's mind, the TAPOVAN was established in the campus. Spirituality allows students for strengthening their intuition, creativity, and inspiration so that they can be guided towards the life and work that they will find most rewarding. The University organizes various workshops and seminars on stress and time management, by eminent resource persons.

Since, Students admitted in time of admission, students including girl only students, general counselling is provided to highlight the importance of the course and provide a guideline to the initiation of a course.

Reorientation programmes are arranged for freshers to make the subject easy. Mentors are allotted for each 10 students for student welfare and to guide them properly. A student's counselling committee for every 20-25 students one faculty counselor is appointed who help the students in academics, co- and extracurricular activities.

The Counselling Cell objectives are:

1. To identifies the problems of the students (academic and non-academic) and reaching an optimal solution.
2. To assists and support the student to make his/her decisions, to work out a plan for solving his /her difficulties and to take action on the plan developed.

Female students are free to discuss any of their personal issues with the counsellor and Women grievance Cell functioning in the school.

The campus has appointed a lady professional counsellor(preferably, Doctor or physiology counsellor) to counsel girl students in dealing with personal issues, mental stress, depression, general disinterestedness in studies, ward-parent and student-faculty relationships, failing in examinations, losses etc. The counsellor in charge of a particular batch of students will be maintaining a file, which may contain the detailed activities and reports of counselling sessions which will be kept confidential. Professional counselling is also done by psychologists, and if needed, psychiatrists for mental stress, depression, anxiety etc. and various invited talks are done to improve the mental and spiritual well-being of students and staff.

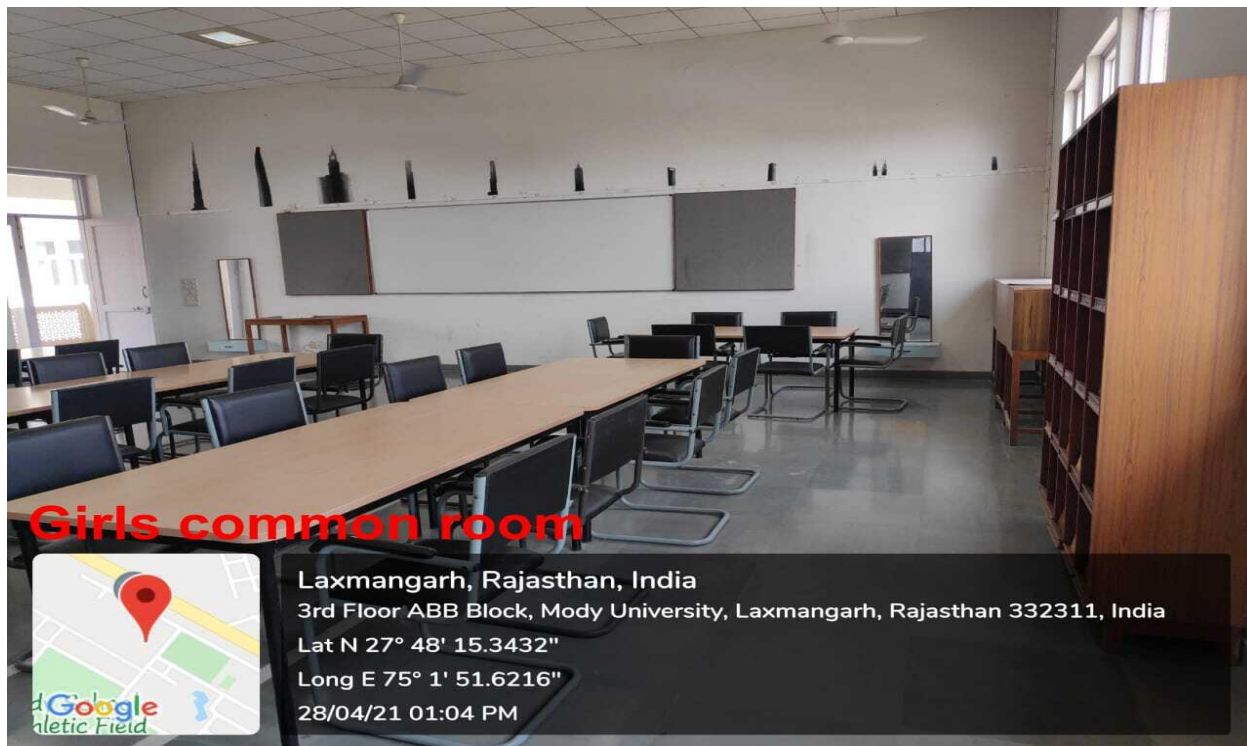

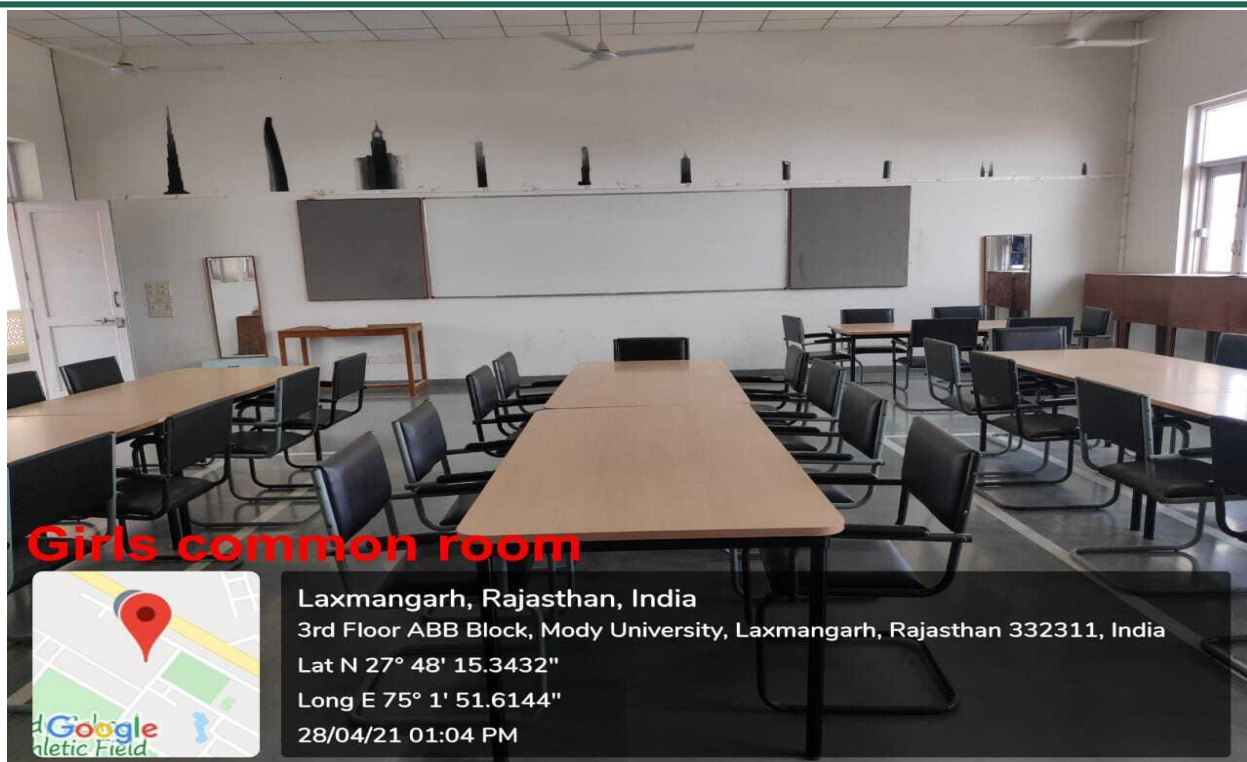
COMMON ROOM

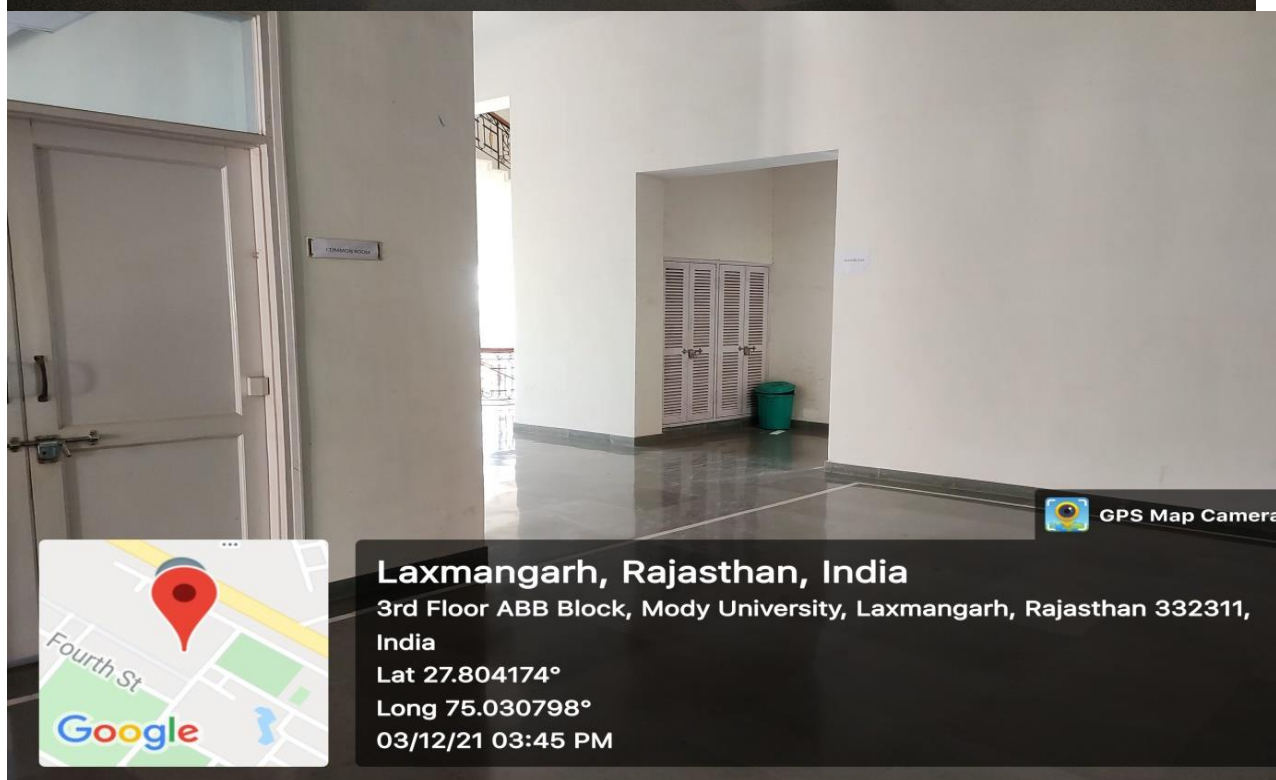
Two common rooms for girl students are provided for the benefit of the female students of the University. The Girls' Common Rooms are situated on the third floor in ABB building and on first floor in School of Business. Both are spacious room and comprises of relaxing table and chairs for the girls to rest and recreation. The common room is provided with chairs and tables and vast reading materials to suit various needs. The common room is adjacent to washroom facilities, water purifier to provide safe and clean drinking water, both cold and normal. The Girls Common room has a lady Aaya deployed for its upkeep and maintenance.

Aaya (lady staff) is available in the Common Room for any assistance to the students. Upon the request of the student or requirement, the student is immediately taken to the Clinic (adjacent to AMM building) by an Ambulance which is functional in Campus 24 x 7 having a dedicated resident lady doctor and qualified nursing staff.

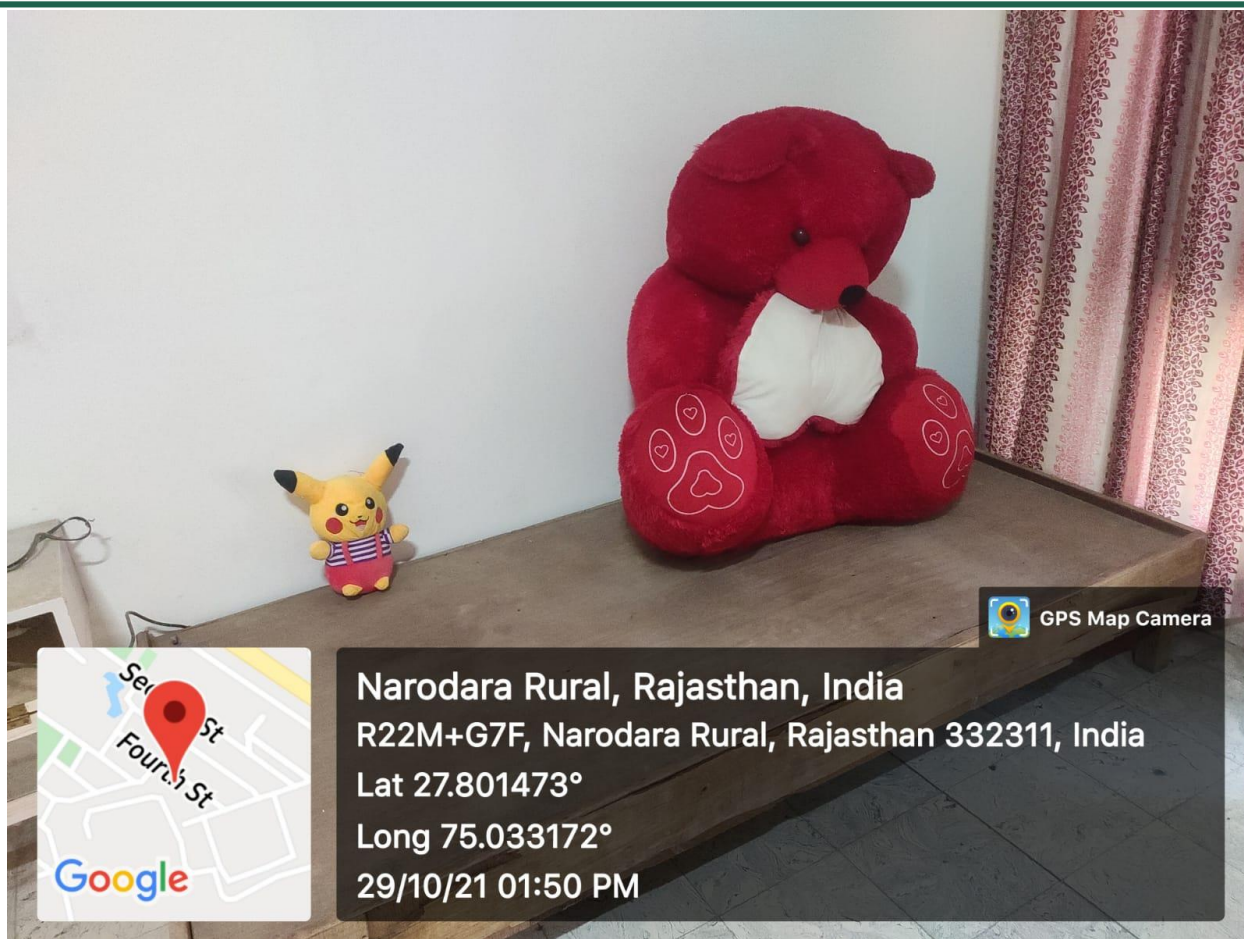
Day Care centre

Develop Antimicrobial Face Mask for Pandemic- 19

The people are very familiar of the fact that the clothes are the home for bacteria to grow and multiply. This results mainly in the transmission of communicable diseases and in general the skin related diseases such as rashes, allergies, irritation, infections, lesions and foul smell. Antimicrobial clothing treated with natural/herbal material are becoming popular as a first barrier towards the bacterial activity in an eco-friendly way.

In past years, very less to nil efforts have been made for the development of antimicrobial fabric using medicinal plants aqueous extracts such as Neem at cottage level using indigenous and traditional techniques. The treated fabric will be having the antimicrobial properties and when this fabric will be used for the preparation of masks it will be far better than the masks prepared from the normal untreated fabric as it will provide protection from the microbes also. Further since the fabric and mask will be prepared using traditional techniques it will provide the ample opportunities for income enhancement to the households at rural level women's. Hence the activity will be taken up with the following objectives:

Objectives:

1. Development antibacterial face mask.
2. Stitching of face mask and face cover providing source of income for rural women's.
3. As per need student's provide training related to cutting, Stitching and dyeing.

Role of institute/ Student's: In the village Lalasi and Bau with the help of panchayat and community people, household women will be identified by the University student's. The households so identified will be trained in a day or two in the University Labs of School of Design by the concerned expert of the University in the development of antimicrobial cotton fabric through Neem leaves using the traditional methods. The household's women will further be trained in the stitching of masks from the developed antimicrobial fabric. The concerned expert & students will provide guidance to the women through the whole process of development of the antimicrobial

Covid-19 masks. These household women will be the model for other women of the village and motivate other women simultaneously. Also the household women will be earning some extra money by preparing these antimicrobial Covid-19 masks. So clearly the University is playing a vital role in enhancing the income of household women along with fulfilling the current need of masks for combating the Covid-19.

(57) Abstract :

A process and composition of preparing a herbal face mask is provided. The process includes dipping leaves of Azadirachta indica and Saraca asoca for overnight in an earthen pot; boiling dipped leaves of Azadirachta indica and Saraca asoca in boiled water in said earthen pot for 45 minutes; straining said pot a multiple times through a strainer; collecting aqueous extract of Azadirachta indica and Saraca asoca after straining; dipping a cotton fabric in presence of alum and salt in aqueous extract of Azadirachta indica and Saraca asoca for 4.5 hrs at 38 oC in said earthen pot; stirring the fabric using a wooden stick during the dipping of the fabric in said aqueous extract of Azadirachta indica and Saraca asoca ; and preparing a herbal face mask using the cotton fabric treated with aqueous extract of Azadirachta indica and Saraca asoca . The composition includes 63% Azadirachta indica by weight; 37% Saraca asoca by weight; and 4 gm Alum and 7 gm Salt I Litre of aqueous extract formed from 63% by weight of Azadirachta indica and 37% by weight of Saraca asoca.
