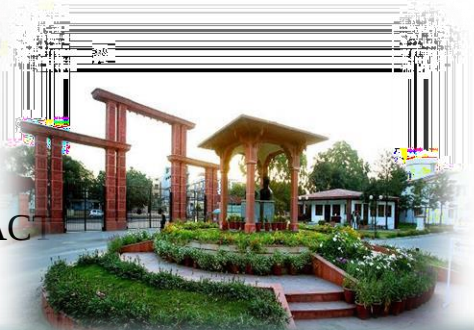

The Program shall educate the students about their rights and empowerment in the society. The program is working to expand women's access to justice and human rights, while combating gender-based violence.

Main Activities

1. Providing Service to the victims of gender based violence can more easily receive shelter, medical services, counseling, and job training.
2. Raise awareness about students' rights and labor laws, such as, the Protection of Women against Harassment Act and other pro-women laws.
3. Promote women-friendly spaces, such as waiting rooms in the university.
4. Advocate for a national census of women working in the informal sector so they have better representation in policy making.
5. Work with the National Commission on the Status of Women to create standardized gender-based violence indicators.
6. Work with universities to offer staff-wide gender-sensitivity training and to promote research studies on gender issues conducted by faculty and students.

- ❖ **Role of Women Health Care workers**

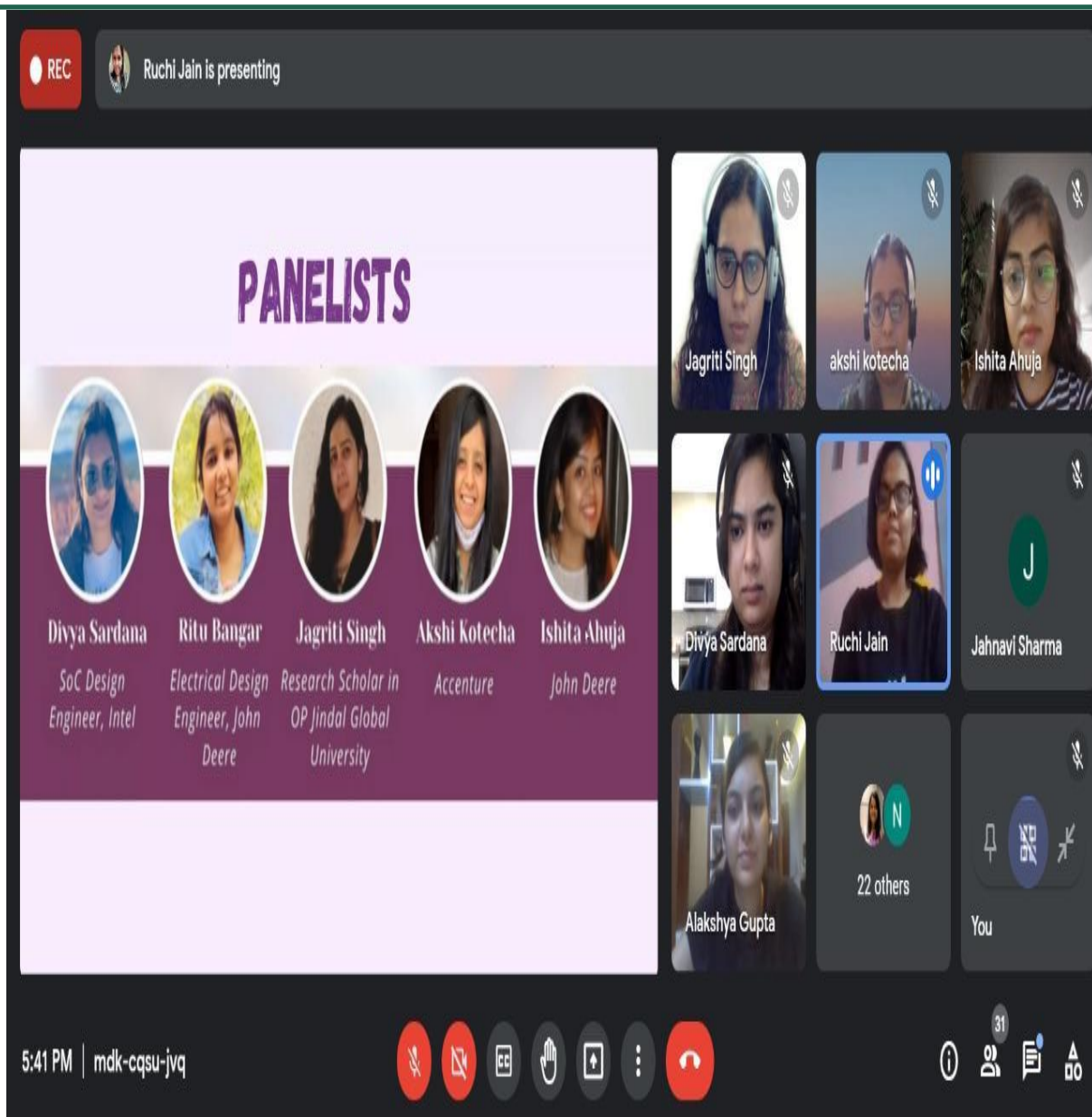

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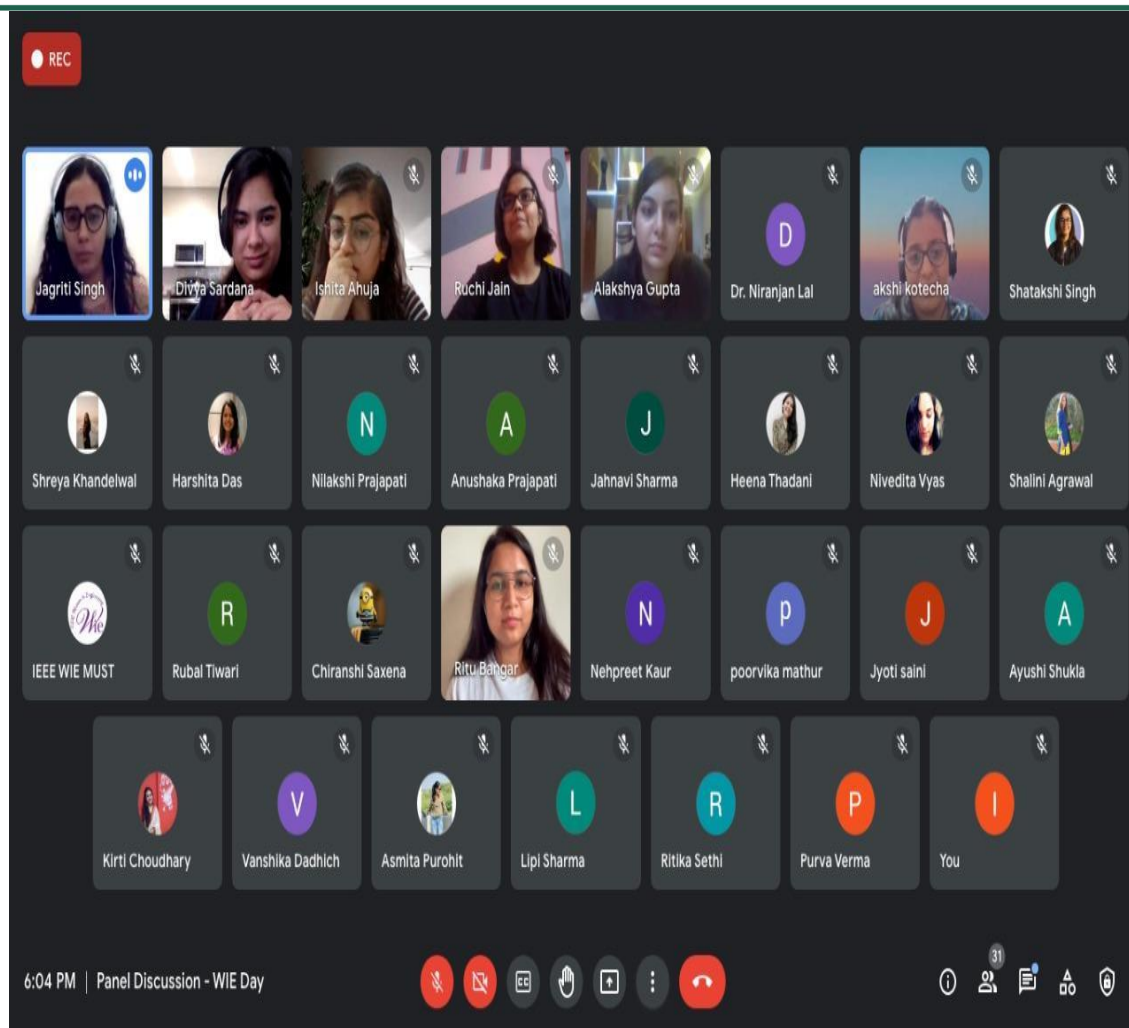

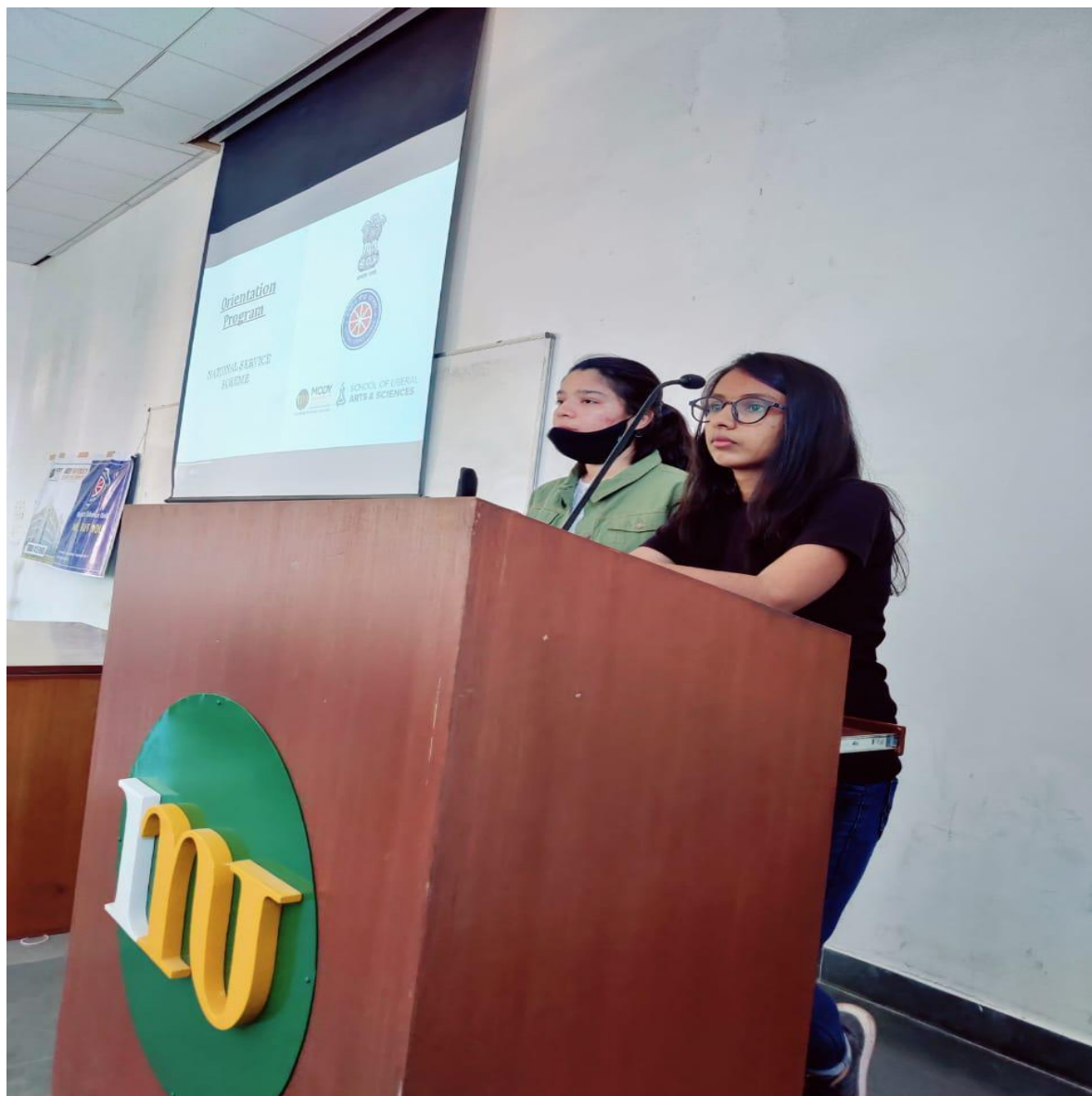

Nukkad Natak 2019

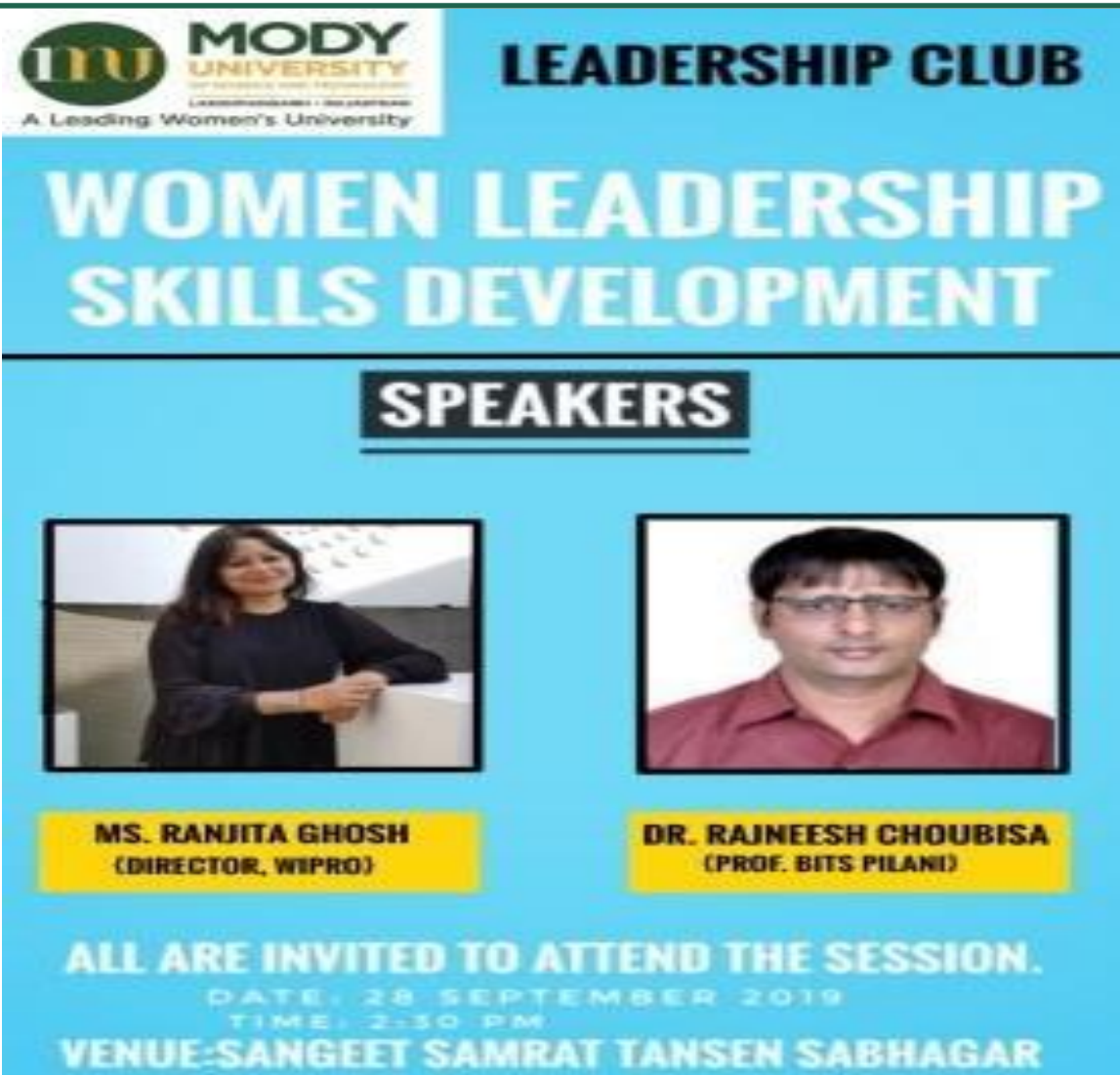


The members of Broadway Impersonators (BIS), the drama society of Anahata, performed a street play(Nukkad Natak) in the streets of village Yalsar.

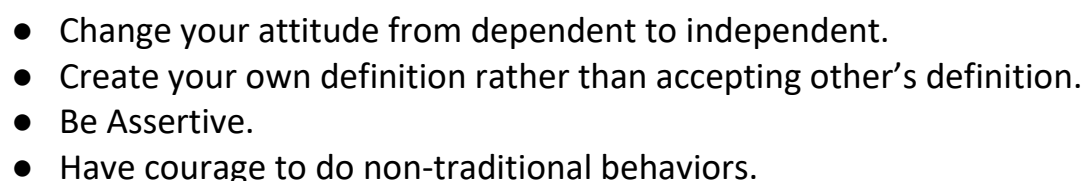

The principle of gender equality is enshrined in the Indian Constitution in its Preamble, Fundamental Rights, Fundamental Duties and Directive Principles. The Constitution not only grants equality to women, but also empowers the State to adopt measures of positive discrimination in favour of women. Within the framework of a democratic polity, our laws, development policies, Plans and programmes have aimed at women's advancement in different spheres. From the Fifth Five Year Plan (1974-78) onwards has been a marked shift in the approach to women's issues from welfare to development. In recent years, the empowerment of women has been recognized as the central issue in determining the status of women. The National Commission for Women was set up by an Act of Parliament in 1990 to safeguard the rights and legal entitlements of women. The 73rd and 74th Amendments (1993) to the Constitution of India have provided for reservation of seats in the local bodies of Panchayats and Municipalities for women, laying a strong foundation for their participation in decision making at the local levels.
