

He believes that if there is no peace in the world, it will fall to pieces. If there is no external war, then the war takes place internally within countries on socio-cultural challenges. He believes that introspection, education, and understanding amongst each other will lead to peace, that is, peace of an individual's mind will mean peace for all. He gave examples of the Russia Ukraine war, the Palestine and Israel issue. Peace is not only threatened by war, though it is a major issue but even inequality and social challenges are major threats to peace.
